A Pronoun replaces a noun. The pronoun is used when we don't know a more specific name or word for the noun. Demonstrative pronouns point to something specific that can be either near or far in distance or time. They are used with or without the noun attached to it depending on the knowledge of the user.

Example: **This** pen is my favorite pen. **That** is not mine.
