A Pronoun replaces a noun. The pronoun is used when we don't know a more specific name or word for the noun. Or it is used to reference a more specific noun or proper noun that has already been used. The object of a sentence is any other noun that is not the subject of the sentence.

Example: Steve Jobs was talking to Bill Gates. Steve Jobs was talking to **him**.
