A Pronoun replaces a noun. The pronoun is used when we don't know a more specific name or word for the noun. Or it is used to reference a more specific noun or proper noun that has already been used. Possessive pronouns replace possessive nouns that show ownership of a thing or a trait.

Example: $E=MC^2$ was Albert Einstein's equation. $E=MC^2$ was **his** equation.
