A Pronoun replaces a noun. The pronoun is used when we don't know a more specific name or word for the noun. Or it is used to reference a more specific noun or proper noun that has already been used. Who or What a sentence is about is the *subject* of a sentence. When we replace the subject we use the subject form of the pronoun (listed in the box on the right).

Example: Albert Einstein was a math genius. He was a math genius.
