They can use the site to help them study in a game-style competition that keep them motivated to learn the vocabulary so they can define concrete words to use in writing.

They can all find and post three pieces of information (two real and one fake) and utilize resources to find out which one is fake helping them develop their ability to relate events accurately, rather than just from opinion.
	Creativity Fluency	Using <a href="http://Prezi.com">Prezi.com</a> for a news story project will challenge the students to create a mixed media project using the 5 I’s of Creativity fluency and the ability to understand a range of media in order to convey “experiences and events precisely” from the news events.

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	Collaboration Fluency	<p><a href="http://Edublog.com">Edublog.com</a> will give the students a chance to share their stories and events and the opportunity to interact with each other to challenge their details. This blog will also be able to be read by children around the world letting the children become global citizens as well. When they post an assignment, they will get (and be obliged to offer) feedback on their work from their peers in class. I would also expect them to respond to someone from outside our classroom developing a dialogue with a peer from some other country that will challenge them to use what they have learned in a real conversation.</p>
